English Curriculum

English is taught daily and follows a three part journey over a two to three week period.

Part one- introduction to the text focusing on engagement, discussion and the building of experiences and cultural capital.

Part two- focus on developing key grammatical skills

Part three-producing extended pieces of writing before editing and refining work.

Guided Reading is taught 4 times a week and gives the children the opportunity to unpick and discuss a wide range of rich and engaging texts while developing the skills to be a confident, fluent reader.

On a Friday, all classes have a reading for pleasure '**Freedom Friday**' session where they are able to choose any book to either share with a friend or read independently. The children also have the opportunity for book talk in these sessions. We believe freedom of choice and peer recommendations play an important role in reading for pleasure.

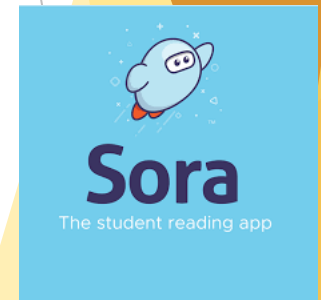


Reading at SFJS

It is the expectation that all children read at home and record it, on Boomreader (or a reading record), at least 4 times a week.

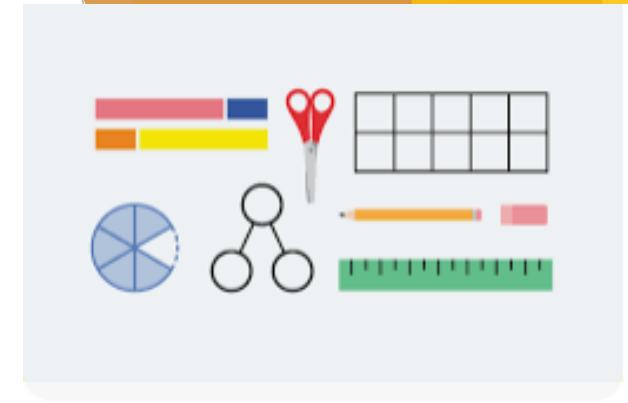
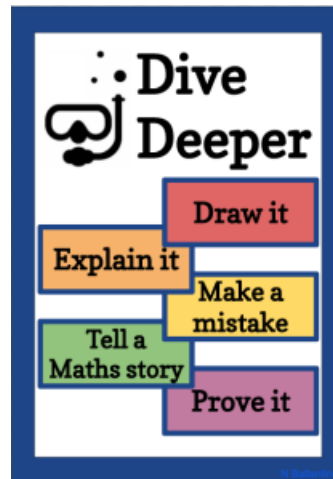


Maths Curriculum

Maths is taught daily. We have adopted a mastery approach to teaching maths and use concrete, pictorial and abstract representations to help children explore, demonstrate and deepen their mathematical understanding.

A typical maths lesson will provide the opportunity for all children to work through fluency, reasoning and problem solving activities.



Times Tables at SFJS



At the end of year 4, children will complete a multiplication tables check as introduced by the Government in 2019.

Whilst we will cover all aspects of this check in school, all children will also need to learn and practise their multiplication tables as part of their weekly home learning.

It is imperative in year 4 that children spend time learning and practising their times tables, ideally at home as well as at school.

By the end of year 2 the expectation is that children can competently answer questions, at speed and in any order, for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

In year 3, they learn the 3, 4 and 8 times tables. In year 4, we focus on 6, 7, 9, 11 and 12.

At SFJS all children have access to Times-tables Rockstars (TTRS) to practice but we also highly recommend using maths frame to practice [MTC maths frame](#)

Homework at SFJS

The homework expectation at SFJS is that all children:

- read and record their reading (using Boomreader or a reading record book if requested) 4 times a week
- learn their spellings, weekly, using Emile
- complete a White Rose Infinity Quiz activity when set (we have tried this out with the children at school)
- **practise their times tables!**

Additional, **voluntary** homework tasks relating to the wider curriculum may also be set.

All homework will be set on **Google Classroom**. If you need paper copies, please contact your child's class teacher.

Itinerary

Accommodation & Food

The accommodation at Ufton Court will be split across two residential sites, the Grade I listed **Tudor Manor house** or the **Woodland Cabins**. Staff will be divided between these two sites.

The beds are a mix of single and bunk beds and the children will be together in dormitory style rooms. Duvets, sheets, pillows etc are all provided, **towels are not**.

All visits are fully catered by their chef and catering team who hold a 5 star food and hygiene rating.

Day one

Morning snack – Fresh fruit on arrival
